Dear Ones,

"Yesterday all my troubles seemed so far away. Now it looks as though they're here to stay. Oh, I believe in yesterday."

Relax, as the year comes to an end, I'm much more of a mind to sing "Side by Side" with you:

Oh! We ain't got a barrel of money Maybe we're ragged and funny But we'll travel along Singing a song Side by side"

It's just that "Yesterday" has been on my mind since Officer Training on Sunday when Malcolm Shearin mentioned it as an example of the Beatles' unique appeal to three generations. I remembered and remarked that I had played it as a piano recital piece. I'm afraid that the way I played "Yesterday" made my teacher, Mrs. Townsend, and the gathered parents and guests wish that it were "Tomorrow" instead. This is what you get when you go to piano practice in your football uniform and are taking lessons because your mother thinks you need culture. Mrs. Townsend, who did not suffer fools gladly, advised my mother that I was wasting her money and her own time as a teacher.

After I finished what turned out to be my swan song that night, Mrs. Townsend's star pupil, Sam Ryburn, made his way to the keys. Sam was made for the piano...delicate, long fingers, a studious introvert, a knack for notes, and a practice ethic that put me to shame. We all knew that he was going to show this when he raised his hands above the keys to play a piece of his own composition. I had heard it in recital practice. It would be good enough to make the audience forget the agony of my "Yesterday" and its troubles here to stay.

But something went wrong.

The opening chord was off. Sam tried again. More dissonance. The room grew hot. Another fail. Another. Another. I lost count. Mrs. Townsend, hardly a warm fuzzy person, came on the stage. She whispered to Sam. He stood up, and she hugged him. His face was red and wet with tears and sweat. Her hug broke the dam, not just for Sam, but for most everybody in the room whose only tears at that point had been ones of agony over the butchering of a Beatles' classic. Sam slinked off stage. She told everyone that he was the most gifted pupil she'd ever taught. Behind the curtain, he smiled at her praise.

I lift this story up to you as the year ends because it is such a great image of the grace of Jesus Christ. He comes to us and wraps his arms around us, even when...or especially when our performance stinks. Those hugging arms of mercy, those affirming words of love give us courage to hold our heads high and to try again. As our year ends and another begins, I rest in this grace. I have been far from perfect, but I will keep trying. His love makes me want to keep trying. He is the same, yesterday, today, and forever.
